#### Aims

The contents will not be published and will be used only for monitoring, development and planning training and support.






#### Responses

## **Responses** – Importance of History



#### **Responses - Networking**


- 39% said they heard of the Gardens Trust. 12% of those were members
- Only 17% had heard of the CGTs, of those 7% were members
- 31% interested (and 48% maybe interested) in networking with the GT
- 27% interested (and 49% maybe interested) in networking with the CGTs
- Top reasons for networking:
  - Sharing knowledge about their Friends group and site
  - Meeting likeminded people
  - Working through issues affecting their green space

# **Responses** – Helping to connect us to other park users

- 68% willing to help us promote our training and networking offer to others via social media and flyers
- 47% willing to talk to some park users about us and our project
